**Additional Notes: Bachelor of Music in Performance – Piano**

*It is imperative that students be knowledgeable of curriculum and University requirements. Although faculty and full-time advisors are available for academic advisement, students must assume personal responsibility for academic progress and completion of program.*

Applied Music

Students must perform a jury examination at the end of each semester in which they do not perform a recital. The jury at the end of each two-semester sequence of applied music will determine eligibility for the next level of study.

Applied lessons are required each term until degree requirements are completed. Completion by jury of MVK 4441 series required.

Keyboard Literature

Courses are not offered every year. Consult an advisor regarding completion.

Ensembles

A minimum of 8 hours of ensemble is required.

A minimum of two hours of ensemble must be taken at the 4000 level.

A minimum of two hours of ensemble must be taken in MUN 2510/4513 (Accompanying).

A minimum of two hours of ensemble must be taken in MUN 2451/4454 (Duo Piano).

A minimum of two hours of ensemble must be taken in MUN 2460/4463 (Chamber Music).

Recital Attendance

Transfers should consult an advisor concerning requirements for student recital attendance (MUS1010).

Course Prerequisites

MUT 1112 is prerequisite to MUL 2110.

MUL 2110 and MUH 2512 are prerequisites to MUH 3211.

MUH 3211 is prerequisite to MUH 3212.

MUT 2117 and MUT 2247L are prerequisites for all advanced theory courses.

Multicultural Requirement

One X (cross cultural) course and one Y (diversity) course are required. MUH 2512 (required for music majors) is an X course. Students should consider selecting an E-Series course that is also a Y course.

Scholarship in Practice

Two Scholarship in Practice courses (with different prefixes) are required. MUT 2116 (Music Theory III), Internships, Study Abroad, many E-Series courses, Applied Music Lessons plus a Recital in the same semester, and courses taken in the Undergraduate Research Opportunity Program (UROP) may be used to satisfy the Scholarship in Practice requirement. Students in this major should consider taking POS 1041 to fulfill the Liberal Studies Social Science requirement, as it also meets the Civic Literacy requirement. If a different course is taken in Social Science, students may satisfy the Civics requirement by scoring at least 60% on the exemption test.

Upper-Division Credits

In order to ensure completion of at least 45 upper-division credits (3000/4000 level courses), a university requirement for graduation, students in this major should choose at least 2 of their Duo Piano, Chamber Music, or Accompanying credits at the 4000 level, or choose at least 2 of their Advanced Theory courses for 3 credits each.
