To be admitted into the Specialized Studies Program in Jazz Studies, the student must obtain written permission from the Director of the Specialized Studies in Jazz. It is expected that the prospective applicant have considerable ability in the area of jazz improvisation, and will be dedicated to jazz performance and jazz education. From the time of acceptance into the Program, the student must play in Jazz Ensembles all semesters of residency (with the exception of the internship semester). It is also expected that all students completing this Program will possess substantial ability in the area of jazz studies and stylistic jazz performance, as demonstrated by the Specialized Studies Program Recital. Approval must be given via jury examination by a committee from the Jazz Studies area before the Lecture/Recital can be presented. This jury, which will include an examination of skills in improvisation, must be taken at least two weeks prior to the prospective recital date.
