SPECIALIZED STUDIES PROGRAM IN EARLY MUSIC

Students applying for a Specialized Studies Program in Early Music must meet one of the following requirements:

- a. Be a registered degree-seeking graduate student in the FSU College of Music

Interested students may be asked to demonstrate an intermediate level of performance ability on an early instrument (e.g. recorder, viol, Baroque oboe, Baroque violin, lute, etc.).

Required coursework must be completed within a period of five years or ten semesters of study. Students must maintain a 3.0 grade point average. A total of six (6) credits (equivalent to FSU coursework) may be transferred from an accredited institution.
