VII. RECITALS, PRELIMINARY EXAM, and TREATISE

PRELIMINARY EXAM

Passing the preliminary exam allows a student to be admitted to candidacy. A student must be admitted to candidacy at least six months prior to the granting of the degree. All requirements of the doctoral degree must be completed within five calendar years from the time the student passes the preliminary examination and is admitted to the candidacy. The preliminary exam consists of written and oral sections, and is taken when the student has completed all coursework or is in the final semester of coursework.

TREATISE OPTIONS

The treatise is a formal written document for which a prospectus has been submitted and approved by the supervisory committee. It must involve research and may be based on either of the following options. All treatises submission requirements and university deadlines apply to both options below.

___Option 1. An extensive research document of a minimum of 12,000 words (not including front and back matter such as title page, table of contents, lists of figures, bibliography and appendices).

___Option 2. A research document of a minimum of 6,000 words (not including front and back matter), based on two public lecture recitals, each lecture comprised of a minimum of 2500 words plus figures and examples. See Graduate Music Handbook for additional treatise and lecture recital guidelines.
