TRI-STATE BAND FESTIVAL

NOVEMBER 30th - DECEMBER 3rd

PURPOSE

The Tri-State Band Festival, hosted by Florida State University, recognizes the accomplishments of outstanding high school musicians from Florida, Georgia, and Alabama. This event offers an intensive four-day musical experience with rehearsals, masterclasses, and concerts led by world-class clinicians, culminating in a finale performances.

As part of the festival, the Director's Conference and Conducting Clinic offers professional development courses, and sessions for band directors, affording them the opportunity to continue their education under the instruction of esteemed FSU faculty members.

HISTORY

In 1971 the Tri-State Festival began exclusively as an honorary jazz band. In 1980, under the direction of Dr. James Croft, a concert ensemble was added to the festival, resembling what we know today as the Tri-State Band Festival. Since then, FSU has hosted the event forty-one times and expanded it to include four concert bands and a honors jazz band, providing thousands of students the opportunity to learn and grow as musicians.

PARTICIPATION COSTS

Participation cost covers lodging, all meals during the Tri-State timeline, transportation to and from rehearsals and concerts, instructional expenses including masterclass, rehearsals, a performance, and a t-shirt. Local student costs include all amenities except for the cost of lodging.

Students selected for the Tri-State Festival must provide their own transportation to and from Tallahassee.

DIRECTORS' CONFERENCE

The Directors' Conference provides high school directors with a continuing education opportunity through sessions presented by our esteemed FSU faculty complete with a conducting clinic. Registered directors receive one complimentary ticket to Friday night's Prism concert and a certificate of completion for professional development credit.

One registration per director; associate/assistant directors employed by a school district with a school district email may also register for the conference. Only school email addresses will be recognized due to professional development procedures. Directors will receive an email directing them to reserve their one complimentary Prism ticket by November 9th, along with a schedule of events for the conference.

CONDUCTING CLINIC

Applications Due: October 25th, 2023

The Conducting Clinic is a component of the Directors Conference led by Dr. Rodney Dorsey. To be considered for participation, send the following criteria to cm-tristatefestival@fsu.edu.

- 2-minute or less conducting demonstration video (optional but highly encouraged)
 - Submit as an unlisted YouTube file.
- Conducting Bio (<500 words)
 - Include your current school
 - How long you have been teaching
 - Your conducting educational background (including institutions)
