Admission

Admission into the Bachelor of Arts in Music – Music Business track does not require a music audition. In addition to completing the supplemental application for the College of Music, an interview, submission of an essay, and unofficial transcripts are required. Students should contact the College of Music's Admissions Office regarding the supplemental application, deadlines, and materials submission.

Musicianship & Performance

Music History

Students must complete all 3 required courses in music history, including:

MUH 2051 (Music in World Cultures)

MUL 2019 (Modern Popular Music)

MUH 2054 (American Roots Music)

Music Theory

Students must complete MUT 1005 (The Art of Songwriting).

Music Skills Competency

Students must complete one of the following sets of applied music courses:

Ensembles

Students must complete 2 ensembles, including MUN 4803 (Old Time Ensemble)

Music Business and Experiential Coursework

Students must complete 23 credits of Music Business coursework, including MUS 4905 (Music Business Capstone Project) and 4 credits of MUS 3934 (Practicum) or 4 non-music elective credits, as well as an internship at an approved site, MUS 4940.

Music Industry Forum

Six terms of MUS 3934: Music Industry Forum are required. Satisfactory grading will be achieved by regular attendance and active participation in the Forum.

Student Recital Attendance

Students must complete 6 semesters of MUS 1010 (Student Recital Attendance). To earn a grade of “Satisfactory”, students must earn 15 recital credits by attending college-approved events. Some events may be worth multiple recital credits. Transfer students should consult their advisor regarding the required number of semesters.

Minor Requirement

Students pursuing Music Business must complete a minor in addition to their music coursework. Options include General Business, Commercial Entrepreneurship, and Social Entrepreneurship.

A grade of C- or better is required in all General Business courses to complete a General Business Minor. These courses are generally available only in an online format. ACG 2021 (Intro to Financial Accounting) is a prerequisite for ACG 2071 (Intro to Managerial Accounting). ACG 2021 and ECO 2013 are prerequisites for FIN 3244 (Financial Markets) and for FIN 3403 (Financial Management).

Likewise, a C- or better must be earned in courses to satisfy either the Commercial or Social Entrepreneurship minors.



CoreFSU

All students subject to FSU's general education requirements must complete 36 credits of coursework as outlined in the CoreFSU Curriculum. For more details about each of these requirements, please see: *It's All Academic 2026*: <https://undergrad.fsu.edu/academic-information/its-all-academic>

Quantitative and Logical Thinking (Math)

Students must complete a total of 6 credits in this area including 3 credits from a State Core course and 3 credits from any Quantitative and Logical Thinking course of their choice. State Core courses include MAC 1105, MAC 2311, MGF 1130, STA 2023 or a course for which one is a prerequisite. If a student takes STA 2023 as their State Core math course, their second math course must have a prefix of MGF or MAC. This requirement must be completed with a grade of C- or better within the first three semesters of undergraduate study, not including summers.

English Composition

Students must complete a total of 6 credits in this area: ENC 1101 and ENC 2135. This requirement must be completed with a grade of C- or better within the first two semesters of undergraduate study, not including summers. Students transferring in with a completed AA degree from a public Florida institution are exempt from taking ENC 2135. All other transfer students should consult their advisor.

Social Science and History

Students must complete 6 credit hours in the combined area of Social Science and History. 3 of these credits must be State Core. Since 3 credits for History will be covered by MUH 3211 (Music History I) or MUH 3212 (Music History II), music majors typically complete 3 credits of a Social Science State Core course. Options include:

- ANT 2000 Intro to Anthropology
- ECO 2013 Macroeconomics
- POS 1041 American National Government
- PSY 2012 General Psychology

*Advisor Recommendation:

- POS 1041 (Required for Civic Literacy)

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Humanities and Cultural Practice

Students must complete 6 credit hours in the area of Humanities and Cultural Practice, including 3 credits must from the list of State Core classes. Since several required courses for the Music Business major fulfill the Humanities requirement, students should complete the only State Core course: PHI 2010 (Introduction to Philosophy) that also meets the university's Ethics requirement.

Alternatively, if a student has credit for any of the following courses...

- ARH 2000 Art, Architecture, and Artistic Vision
- HUM 2020 The Art of Being Human: Examining the Human Condition Through Literature, Art, and Film
- LIT 2000 Introduction to Literature

- THE 2000 Introduction to Theatre

...they may complete any approved Ethics course and are not restricted to PHI 2010.

Natural Science

Students must complete 6 credits of Natural Science lecture courses. One of the following Natural Science State Core courses is required.

- BSC 1005 General Biology for Non-Majors
- CHM 1020C General Chemistry for Non-Majors
- ESC 1000 Introduction to Earth Science
- EVR 1001 Introduction to Environmental Science
- OCE 1001 Elementary Oceanography
- PHY 1020 Physics and Technology for Future Presidents

Natural Science Lab

In addition to the above 6 credits, students must complete 1 credit of a Natural Science Laboratory, either as a separate laboratory course designated by the course suffix “L” (e.g., BSC 1005L) or as a combined lecture/lab course designated by the course suffix “C” (e.g., CHM1020C).

Writing “W”

Students must complete 6 credit hours of Writing “W” courses. The first of these course requirements is satisfied through MUH 2054. Both courses used to satisfy the requirement must be completed with a grade of C- or better.

Scholarship in Practice & Formative Experience

Students must complete two “SIP” or “FE” courses: one of each or two of a kind. This requirement is fulfilled through satisfactory completion of MUS 4905 (Music Business Capstone Project) and MUS 4940 (Internship).

Exploring the Human Experience

Students must complete two Exploring the Human Experience courses in total. One EHE course is fulfilled with MUH 2051 (Music in World Cultures). The second EHE requirement will be satisfied with the successful completion of MUH 2054 (American Roots Music), which is also a Writing “W” course.

Oral Communication Competency

Students must complete one Oral Communication Competency course. Options for completing this requirement may be found via the following link:

Upper-Division Writing

Students must complete one Upper-Division Writing course. This requirement is fulfilled by taking an approved course and earning a grade of C- or better.

Civic Literacy

Students must complete the Civic Literacy requirement by passing one of the following with a grade of C- or better **AND** passing the Civic Literacy Exam.

- POS 1041 American National Government
- AMH 2010 A History of the United States to 1877
- AMH 2020 A History of the United States Since 1877
- Transfer credit from IB History: History of America (score of 5 or higher)
- Transfer credit from AP Government and Politics: United States (score of 3 or higher)
- Transfer credit from AP United States History (score of 4 or higher)

The Civic Literacy Exam can be taken any time before graduation. The exam is free of charge and is administered in person at the FSU Testing Center. It may also be taken at an approved off-campus site with proctored testing.

Non-Music Electives

Students must complete a minimum of 9 non-music elective credits. Most students complete these elective credits through auxiliary AP credit, dual enrollment, or other courses taken at FSU.

+Foreign Language

All university students who receive a BA degree from FSU must demonstrate proficiency in a classical or modern foreign language through the intermediate level. Students can satisfy the foreign language requirement with coursework through the 2000 level (2220 or the equivalent



course) or with an equivalent CLEP or language placement test score. If the foreign language requirement is satisfied via testing, those credits must be replaced with additional non-music electives. Foreign language courses may be taken on an S/U basis. More info:

Upper-Division Credit Total

Students must complete a total of 45 credits of upper-division coursework. Upper-division coursework constitutes courses at the 3000 or 4000 level, including music courses. Students are encouraged to seek non-music electives which also fulfill upper-division credits.

Engage 100

Music majors are exempt from FSU's Engage 100 requirement.
